BRIEF HISTORY OF WRITE BY THE RAILS AUGUST 2011 – APRIL 2020

Write by the Rails (WbtR) aims to raise the profile of the local literary community and explore ways we can nurture, cultivate and help the writing community grow. The area's longest-running literary group with a statewide affiliation, Write by the Rails is the Prince William area chapter of the non-profit Virginia Writers Club which celebrated 100 years in 2018. The following is a brief description of our activities since our launch at Okra's Cajun Creole in Manassas, VA August 8, 2011.

OVERVIEW OF REGULAR ACTIVITIES

- WbtR holds monthly meetings and enrichment events to encourage local writers in their craft;
- WbtR holds full-day writing workshops twice per year;
- WbtR writes and sends newsletters to members and the community at least monthly;
- Meetings are announced on our website, in our newsletter and through our Facebook profiles;
- Chapter members network through daily posts in a Closed Private Facebook group facebook.com/groups/Writebytherails;
- Announcements are made on our public Facebook page facebook.com/WritebytheRails;
- WbtR sponsors writing contest at least annually.

NOTEABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- WbtR has encouraged and assisted members in getting over fifty books published since 2011;
- Since 2011, members have contributed articles on local authors, books and literary projects to media outlets such as Prince William Living and Haymarket Lifestyle magazines; PotomacLocal.com, Patch.com, InsideNova.com and BristowBeat.com; and Southern Writers magazine;
- Members' books can be found in the local libraries and select retail outlets. Our members regularly conduct book signings at a variety of local venues;
- We have hosted "How to Market Your Book" and other panel discussions with local, experienced authors at least annually since 2011;
- We created and distributed an information brochure in 2011;
- We created WriteByTheRails.org (also at WbtR.org) in 2011;
- WbtR became the Prince William Chapter of the Virginia Writers Club in 2012;
- We published an anthology, *New Departures*, by WbtR members in 2012;
- WbtR published a second anthology, *No Additional Postage Necessary*, by participants at Rising Writers Workshop in 2014;

- WbtR started a social media campaign #BackonTrackNow promoting writing by having writers share a short poem, nine-word memoir or Twitter-friendly blurb of creative non-fiction. WbtR shared the posts and then published the 2019 #BackOnTrack anthology with selected works from this project.
- Members have participated in book sales, signings and readings at numerous locations (such as Prospero's Books, Richard McKay's Used Books, Barnes & Noble, The Manassas Museum, Books-A-Million and 2nd and Charles, as well as the Mill Street Studio, Staples and J.E. Rice Tru Value Hardware).
- Members have hosted their book launches at various locations (such as Giuseppe's Ristorante Italiano Desiderio's), Merchant Gallery at the Candy Factory, Lion & Bull, McKay's Used Books and Manassas Baptist Church).
- We have held several Write by the Rails member Blog Tours to promote our various authors.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- We conduct readings, discussions and book signings at the annual Arts Alive! festival sponsored by the Prince William Arts Council;
- We have had members participate in 1st Friday in Old Town Manassas, Manassas Fall Festival and other regional events;
- Members have donated books to fundraisers for the American Red Cross and Rainbow Riding Center, and donated books to stock the Little Free Libraries and the library at the Bull Run Warrior Retreat for wounded service members and their families;
- Members donate books to local schools and participate in classroom reading programs;
- Members have and continue to donate books to children in disadvantaged communities and to non-profits serving those communities;
- WbtR held the Rising Writers Workshop, a one-day workshop for teens and adults, partnering with Woodbridge High School's CFPA Creative Writers Program and member educators (2014-2017);
- WbtR helped organize Fall for the Book's Haute Cuisine at the Hylton event, an evening event focusing on books and local food, partnering with George Mason University (2013-2015);
- We have been active members of the Interservice Club Council of Manassas (ISCC-Manassas.org), the Prince William County Arts Council (pwcartscouncil.org) and the Prince William Chamber of Commerce (pwchamber.org).

CREATION OF SUSTAINABLE LITERARY WRITING PROJECTS

- In 2014 Write by the Rails launched the Prince William County Poet Laureate Program working with the PWC Arts Council, Tackett's Mill and the Clearwater Foundation. The Laureates have a visible presence throughout Prince William County. The Board of County Supervisors subsequently designated an official day for the Poet Laureate program and the Laureate.
- Write by the Rails was instrumental in the 2015 launch of Spilled Ink hosted by John Dutton. Spilled Ink is an open mic night that celebrates the written word.
- In 2019, WbtR launched Poems Around Town, an area-wide poetry installation. Member poems are placed in businesses and public buildings and hosts are promoted on the website and through social media.
